- LSAT scores are the single most important piece of data reviewed by law schools when enrolling students. It is therefore important that students prepare *early* in their college careers for that exam.
- Every semester, H-SC faculty, working with PLS, offer *free* LSAT preparation for our students. These workshops review important skills such as critical reading, logic, and test-taking strategies.
- The Ferguson Career Center offers practice LSAT tests and help with résumé preparation.
