- When choosing a course, select courses that will **enhance your language skills** first! Be sure to read carefully the pre-requisites and the skill levels required. A 301 course is NOT necessarily easier than a 305 course.
- Do not take a 400-level course in your first year of the major, unless advised by your instructor, advisor, or Department chair.
- Majors are encouraged to strike a balance among courses on language, culture, and literature.
- Majors should consider joining the Foreign Language Honors Society and Language Clubs and participating in the Conversation Table for Advanced Students.
