- Minors are encouraged to strike a balance among courses on language, culture, and literature.
- Minors should consider joining the Foreign Language Honors Society, Language Clubs and participating in the Conversation Table for Advanced Students. Talk to your instructor to obtain a current schedule for meeting times and locations.
