Honor Code

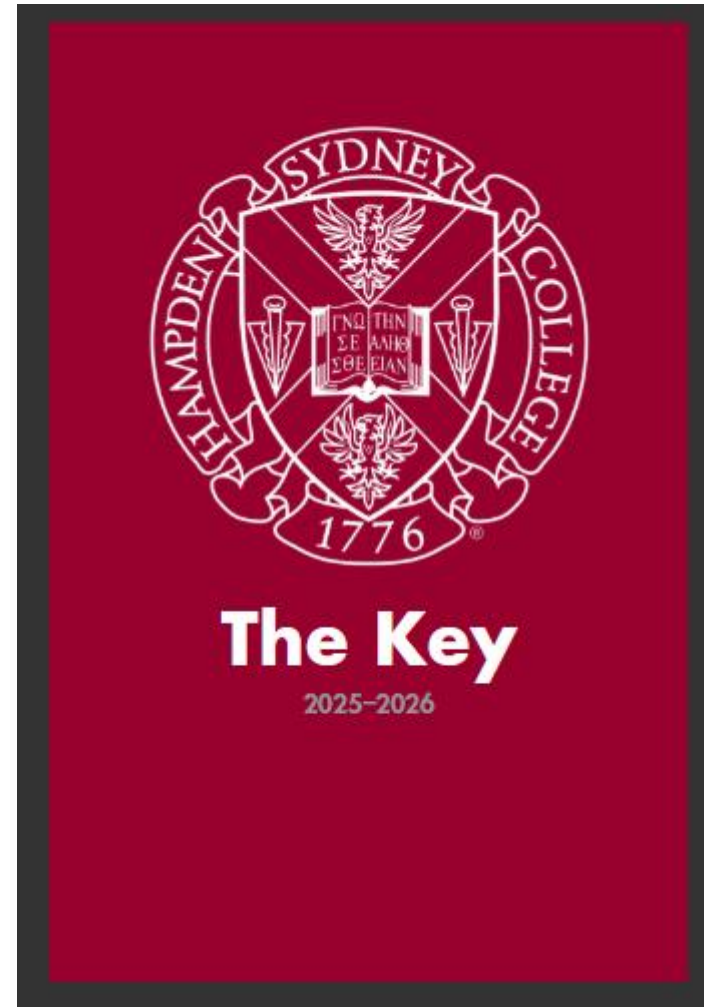

What steps do I take to have a mobile Student ID?

- You will have access to two videos explaining the process.
- First you need to download the app, and submit a picture of a government issued ID. You may need to take a picture then screen shot it to make it a manageable size.



What steps do I take to have a mobile Student ID?

- You will then upload your photo. Please read the instructions on a suitable photo.
- Once you submit these two photos, they will be approved or denied.
- If approved, you may move onto the next step of setting it up in your mobile wallet and/or on your mobile watch.
- If denied, please submit the two photos again.
- The Student ID is used to open doors at dorms and to sign in at the dining hall.



Clubs and Organizations

- Hampden-Sydney recognizes over 75 active student-run clubs, ranging from religious and community service groups, such as the Catholic Campus Ministries and Hampden-Sydney Mentor Program, to groups oriented toward outdoor adventure like the Outsiders, Cycling, and Fly Fishing clubs.

Firearm Regulations

- Firearms are allowed on campus, but immediately upon arrival, they must be checked into the H-SC Police Department
- No hand guns are allowed, only long guns, shotguns, rifles, and archery equipment (limit of 3, in combination)

Things to do on and around campus

- Our campus of 1,400 rural acres and the surrounding countryside provides H-SC students with a wide variety of outdoor activities, such as camping, kayaking, cycling, fishing, a nine-hole campus golf opportunity, and clay target shooting.
- The Office of Student Affairs provides all students the option to check out outdoor equipment (free of charge), including canoes, kayaks, paddle boards, tents, sleeping bags, corn hole sets, and much more. Interested students should visit OSA in the Brown Student Center to borrow equipment.

Things to do on and around campus

- OSA also provides 20 golf passes, available to sign out daily, that allow your son to play a round of golf at The Manor Golf Club for free (offered on a first-come, first-served basis).
- In addition to ball golf, the College also has an 18-hole disc golf course that is located at the scenic Tadpole Hole pond. Students can check out disc golf bags at Kirby Sports Center and Bortz Library.

- At your scheduled advising time, please have your TigerWeb username and newly established password available.
- We will review and make adjustments to your fall schedule.
