How to find MAC Addresses for Streaming and Gaming Devices

Amazon

Amazon Echo

- 1. Download the Amazon Alexa app to your phone or computer from the app store.
- 2. Sign in with your Amazon account.
- 3. On your phone connect to the wireless network transmitted by your Echo device.
- 4. The wireless MAC address for your Echo can be found at the bottom of the Echo Setup screen in the Alexa app.

Fire Stick

- 1. From the Amazon app, visit the **Home** screen
- 2. Choose **Settings**
- 3. Choose My Fire TV or Device
- 4. Choose **About**
- 5. Choose **Network**
- 6. The wifi MAC address should be located under MAC Address (Wi-Fi)

Streaming Devices

Apple TV

- 1. With your Apple TV remote, navigate to the Settings icon and select it.
- 2. From the **Settings** menu, select **General**
- 3. Select **Network**
- 4. Your MAC Address will be next to either **Wi-Fi Address** or **Ethernet Address** depending on whether you are connected to the internet via Wi-Fi or a wired connection.

Roku/Roku Express

- 1. On the back on your Roku there are a pair of six 2-digit pairs separated by colons, e.g. 00:0D:0A:1H:3G:5C. One set is for the Ethernet connector and for the other for the wireless connector.
- Alternatively, from the Roku home screen, select Settings > Network > locate the value next to Wireless MAC Address

Smart TV/Bluray Player

- Most MAC Addresses can be obtained from the Settings Menu, either under the Network or About sections
- 2. Alternatively, check with the manufacturer for instructions on how to obtain the MAC Address for your specific model

Nintendo Consoles

Nintendo DS

To locate the MAC Address from a Nintendo DS, you must first insert a Nintendo Wi-Fi Connection compatible game and access the WFC Setup Utility. Please note that the exact steps to access the setup utility varies by game. However, the setup utility is a standard menu, included with all WFC-compatible games.

- 1. After accessing the utility, tap **Options**, then **System Information**
- 2. The MAC Address and Nintendo WFC ID will be listed on the screen. Unless the game player has successfully connected with Nintendo Wi-Fi Connection, the WFC ID will be blank

Nintendo 3DS

- 1. From the HOME menu, highlight and select the **System Settings** Icon
- 2. Select Internet Settings
- 3. Tap Other Information
- 4. Tap Confirm MAC Address. Your system's MAC Address will be displayed on the screen

Wii U

- 1. From the Wii U Menu, select System Settings
- 2. Using the Left Stick select the **Internet icon** and press the A Button
- 3. Select View MAC Address and wait a moment for the MAC Address to be displayed

Nintendo Switch

- 1. From the Switch's Home menu, go to **System Settings**
- 2. Scroll down and select Internet
- 3. The MAC address will appear under System MAC Address

Microsoft Consoles

Xbox 360

- 1. Select **System Settings**
- 2. Select Network Settings

- 3. Select Configure Network
- 4. Under Basic Settings check to make sure IP Settings is set to Automatic
- 5. Go to Additional Settings
- 6. Select Advanced Settings
- 7. The MAC Addresses for the wired and wireless adapters should be displayed

Xbox One

- 1. Navigate to My Games and Apps
- 2. Select **Settings**
- 3. Select **Network**
- 4. Select Advanced Settings
- 5. The MAC Addresses for the wired and wireless adapters should be displayed

Xbox Series X or Series S

- 1. Navigate to the **Settings** page.
- 2. Select Network
- 3. Select Advanced Settings
- 4. Under **IP** settings, the MAC address will be listed next to **Wired MAC** and **Wireless MAC** on the right-hand side of the screen (this is also where the IP address and other information is located).

Sony Consoles

Playstation 3

- 1. From the main menu, select Settings
- 2. Select **System Settings**
- 3. Select **System Information**
- 4. The MAC Address will then be displayed on the screen

Playstation 4

- 1. Arrow up and over to Settings in the PS4 menu
- 2. Scroll down to Network
- 3. Scroll down to View Connection Status
- 4. The MAC Address will be listed next to MAC Address

Playstation 5

- 1. From the Playstation Home screen, select **Settings** in the upper right
- 2. Select **System**
- 3. Select System Software
- 4. Select Console Information
- 5. The MAC address will be listed by MAC Address(Wi-Fi)
