The minor in Latin American Studies consists of eighteen hours in addition to successful completion of Spanish 201-202 or any 300-level course in Spanish. Students pursuing a major or an additional minor in a related field (i.e. Spanish or History) may apply up to 6 credit hours towards both minors, or toward the related major. The coursework for the Latin American Studies minor must include:
