Important information for PSYC majors: (There is no PSYC minor offered at H-SC.)

- PSYC majors are strongly encouraged to meet with their academic advisor at least once a semester to ensure adequate course planning as the PSYC course numberings have changed.
- PSYC majors are prepared and able to pursue advanced study or careers in fields besides just
 Psychology (law, medicine, business, education, coaching, law enforcement, etc.) Majors learn how
 to find and interpret research and how to use those research findings to form evidence based
 conclusions.
- Students are encouraged to complete PSCY 101 by the end of their sophomore year.
- PSYC 210 and 211/251 (now PSYC 250) are recommended to be taken during the sophomore year, but must be completed before the senior year of study.
- Students may develop interdisciplinary majors within the social and natural sciences with the approval of the departments concerned.
- Students are also strongly encouraged to complete at least one 300-level lab during their junior year. Taking multiple upper-level lab courses in the same semester should be avoided.
- Students seeking admission to graduate study in Psychology are encouraged to take more than the required number of courses in Psychology and to choose their electives from Sociology or Biology.
- Students interested in graduate programs should inquire into research opportunities during their sophomore years. Creating and conducting a research project takes time. Summer internships in related employment settings are also highly regarded by members of graduate admissions committees.
