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Important information for students:

- Students are typically placed into LATN 101 and must petition to be moved upward
- Students wishing to study both GREK and LATN should stagger them so they do not start both in the same year (LATN 101 + GREK 101 = ⊗, LATN 201 + GREK 101 = OK)
- Students are encouraged to study abroad and will need to plan ahead! Second semester junior year is best, but other times will work as well. Consult your faculty as scholarships may be available! Consider programs like College year in Athens (semester/year/summer options); ICCS in Rome; ICCS in Sicily; and Vergilian Society Summer Programs.
- The Classics Club provides opportunities for trips, socializing and events such as the Classics Quiz Bowl. Also, the Eta Sigma Phi Honor Society provides social and networking opportunities.
- Majors may wish to take advantage of the Southern Teachers Agency (STA), a placement service for seniors/recent graduates wishing to teach high school Latin.
